It is said in the U.S. that as many as one million Americans might already have been infected with the AIDS virus; of these, one in five could come down with the disease within five years after infection

And also the disease creates new discrimination between the patients and others. Now AIDS patients are likely to be excluded from the society.

AIDS have a great impact on today's society. These conditions, I think, make this play into existence. This year, we of the Hitotsubashi–Tsuda Joint Production perform the drama named "AS IS". It is quite difficult for us to create the world of the homosexuals and AIDS patients because there are no such persons(?) in our production. But I hope this drama let you know the significance of AIDS problem. And not only that, I hope all of you also reconsider the most important thing for human beings — the meaning of the "TRUE LOVE" beyond the sex.

STORY

A modern black plague, AIDS, has a dreadful power which excludes its victims from their relatives, co-workers, friends and lovers. This is a story of two gay men. One is the victim of AIDS. The other continues to stick with him—to resist the power. Their names are Rich and Saul.

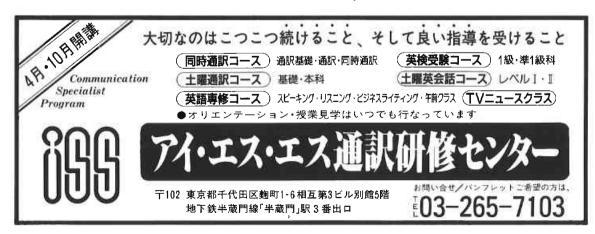

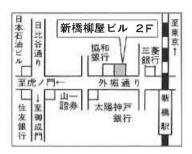


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
